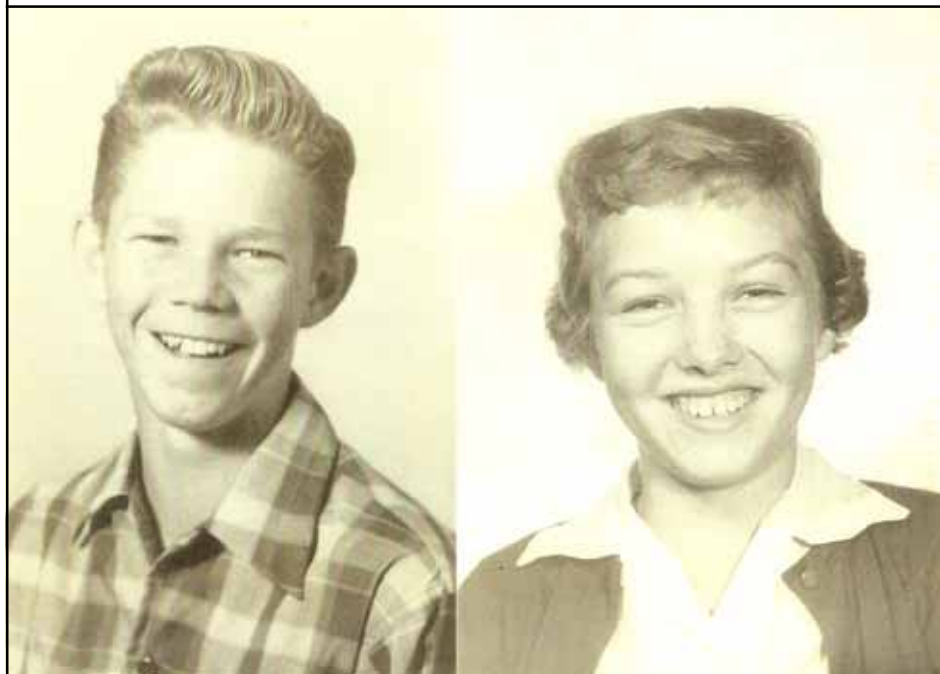
Making friends is easy in TSC. Attending a social event or signing up for a trip is the key.
