TSC's last domestic ski trip of the 2006-07 season went to Crested Butte over the second half of the week that marked spring break for most school districts. The weather was warm as we started out, but we were headed for snow!

Finding parking spaces at Fine Airport Parking was a catch-a-s-catch-can proposition.

The lots were jammed with the cars of people who were off on their own spring break trips. We encountered the same situation on last year's trip. Next year's Board will be looking at alternate parking arrangements.

Once we got organized and the bus departed, Trip Captain **John Hill** and his team distributed our bus dinners. **John** and team had done home-made dinners

with poor-boy sandwiches and other goodies. **John** figured out a long time ago that feeding skiers well is the first step toward a successful event. **Kelley Phillips** remembered the vegetarian sandwiches from last year's trip and ordered one for herself this time. Grilled

We encountered a little bad weather on the way out – mostly snow and fog – in the Monarch Pass area on the trip out, but we didn't lose too much time and managed to reach Crested Butte before the lifts opened.

We arrived at our lodging, the Nordic Inn, and found that all of our rooms were ready for us – no need to use

change rooms. That's pretty good for a spring break trip, when accommodations tend to be crowded.

The Nordic Inn isn't like the condos or hotels where TSC trips usually stay. It's more like a B&B, with hotel-type rooms and a big lobby / social area where people gather to socialize. Our hosts, **Alan** and **Judy Cox**, took very good care of us. Most of the Nordic staff have been there

Our first evening at the Nordic included a very nice welcome party with lots of beverages and things to munch on. Each morning featured an elaborate continental breakfast served in the dining room, which became our group's social and skiing nerve center prior to each day's skiing. It was a great place to catch up on the previous day's news and make plans for the coming day.

By the time we arrived on our first day, lift passes had already been delivered to the Nordic. **Anita Maggio** distributed the lift passes while Trip Captain **John Hill** oversaw unloading the bus and got everyone oriented to the mountain base and pointed toward the equipment rental shop.

On this trip we were skiing in Daylight Savings Time (which started early this year and surprised a lot of us). By the end of the ski day, the sun was still high in the sky, and it felt a little strange. Recognizing the situation, management kept the main lift at the base



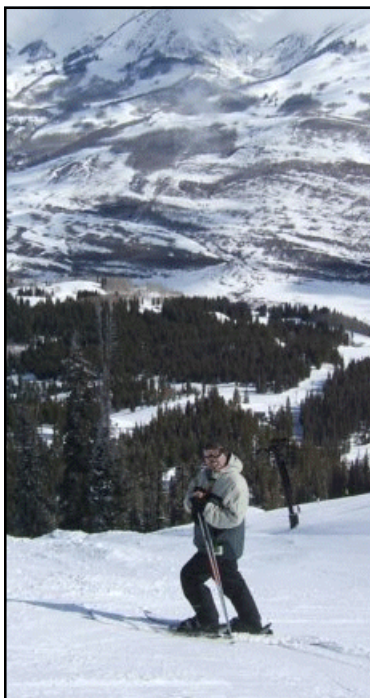
running until 5:30. This being the case, some items on the trip schedule had to shift around a little, but everyone seemed to cope.

Each skiing day's agenda included a designated location on the mountain to gather for lunch. This worked out pretty well, and participants had an opportunity for some mid-day socializing and comparing of notes about where skiing was best.

During this trip we encountered springtime snow conditions:

- Each morning the slopes were frozen and icy.
- The snow softened up during the day.
- By the end of the day most of the slopes were covered with lumpy mashed potatoes.
- The slope just above the base was a big challenge at the end of the day. The snow was lumpy and cruddy, and EVERYONE (advanced skiers, beginner skiers, and all the rest) had to ski through it.

We had expected plenty of spring break sunshine, but mostly the skies were gray,



and we even got snow on a couple of occasions. Our trip coincided with the end of spring break, though, and crowds were very light. Just like last year, we had the mountain to ourselves. I dislike lift lines and I HATE skiing in traffic (it's just too dangerous), but we didn't have to worry about either on this trip. Lift lines were less than a minute long, and we had lots of elbow room on the slopes.

At the end of each day's skiing, we gathered in the hot tub to socialize amongst ourselves, meet some of our fellow guests at the Nordic, tell stories about the day's skiing, make plans for the next day, and just look around at the panorama of wonderful scenery! A little wine by the tub made the event even more mellow.

TSC member **Sonny Parrish** drove in from his new home in Pagosa Springs to visit with daughter **Kelley Phillips** and do a little skiing (and in **Sonny's** case, that always seems to include a little racing).

The trip agenda had included a Friday assault on the public NASTAR course. When we got there, though, we found that the course had been reserved for a private race. Some from the trip returned to the course Friday afternoon. Others were back Saturday morning. Our group did win some medals, including:

Keystone one day - an ill-advised choice) and he ended up having a great time, improving his skills a lot, and learning that the scenery seen from the top of the mountain is the most spectacular.

Our stay at Crested Butte finally drew to an end Sunday afternoon, and we boarded the bus to head home. Like most return trips, the bus during the ride back was pretty quiet. People were tired and were thinking about the work / school week ahead. The only significant event on the return trip was a pizza stop at Canon City.

We enjoyed good weather on the return trip and reached Tulsa in plenty of time to get on with our days. It was a great trip and a good way to end the ski season!
