President's Column

NEWS FROM SKI COUNTRY

- * Pine Tree Devastation – As your ski bus drives to Keystone, Breckenridge, or Vail, notice thousands of dead Lodgepole pine trees on the north side of the highway between Silverthorne and Frisco. Pine Beetles are the culprit, but no decrease in property value is expected. These devastating beetles are moving south, and brown trees can now be seen towards Breckenridge. Our Breckenridge trip looks like one on our best remaining values this ski season, with it's ski in/ski out convenience.
- * Vail Ski Resort – Eight huge cranes have been erected in various locations in Vail Village. Much more growth is apparent and many new multi story buildings are rising.
- * Changeable electronic signs tower over I-70 ski country areas. These brilliantly illuminated signs are very visible, and let us know how many minutes required to all ski resorts, tunnels, and towns, according to traffic conditions.
- * Kincaid hopes to have a newly patented seating/sleeper system installed on our ski bus by winter trip time. They will be improved but will be consistent with the historical configuration of booths, tables, and bunks. This has proved to be best system for co-mingling before lights out.
- * September 2007 diesel and gasoline prices in Summit County, Colorado, were \$3.08 and \$2.99 respectively. It's unusual because these fuel types are priced oppositely in Tulsa, where diesel is cheaper than gasoline this year. Last year was vice-versa... go figure.

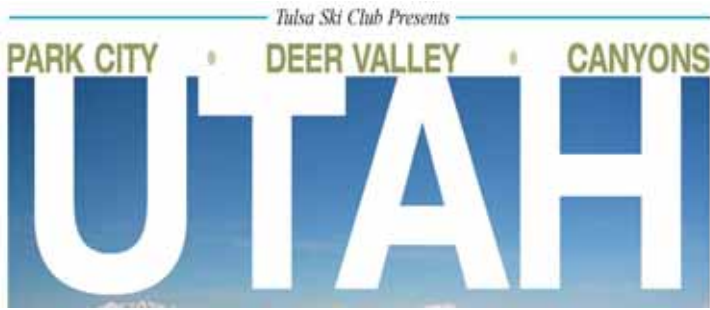
