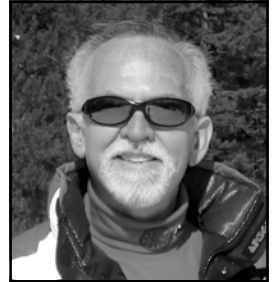

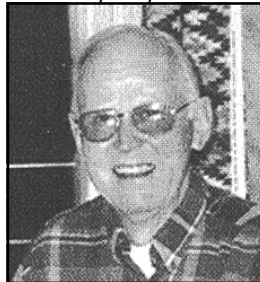

Editor's Notes

The July *Lift Line* was photocopied instead of printed. The quality was not as good as the printed version. We were looking to see what cost savings may be made by copying versus printing. The *Lift Line* is the Club's most expensive item on the budget, so it gets attention to see what can be done to reduce costs. The TSC Board is evaluating the role of the *Lift Line* and our website and how they can work together to help reduce costs and provide the best message we can to existing and future TSC members. We are looking at methods of getting the *Lift Line* to the membership in a timely manner. In July there was a 7-day difference in mail delivery to the same neighborhoods. This may be a problem due to vacationing postmen; not sure. The only control we have to get the process going as early as we can each month. So we have voted to move our Board meeting five days earlier each month to see if this will help the delivery process. We are also investigating other issues to get better delivery. The *Lift Line* is available online at www.tulsaskiclub.com by the first of the month or sooner.

Summer is a great time of year to visit your favorite ski area and check out if they allow bike riding down the mountain. The die hard people ride their bikes up the mountain first before they come down. I myself like the \$10 ride up the mountain on the chair lift. Your bike goes up with you on the chair lift hanging from a hook. Getting down the mountain in a safe and fun method is my goal. Keystone has all their trails marked in Green, Red, Blue and Black. I have only been on the green trails. To get down safely without hurting yourself is a two-hour venture. You should have a full suspension mountain bike to take even on the green runs. They rent these bikes locally for about \$35 a trip. These



bikes are \$1000-\$1500 each, so they are built tough for rentals. As in all things in the mountains, you want to get started early in the day to avoid afternoon thunderstorms. Scary as they are scary in Oklahoma, they are just as scary in the mountains and they are a lot closer. Lightning strikes seem to hit right next to you. Storms can contain a lot of hail, and the hard pounding rain can start the mud flowing. Luckily, they are very consistent in the late afternoon and not in the morning. There was still a lot of snow up top in the shaded areas over the 4th of July. Go slow and enjoy the view; it makes for a great day. You learn quickly that you always brake with the back brake first, or you will be going over the handle bars in quick order when riding down the mountain. Helmets are mandatory. I have bike helmets which are good, but if you have a ski helmet, they are better for this endeavor. Just like in skiing, always plan on falling. And again, just like in skiing, you mostly

fall when you get too much confidence and want to go faster down the hill. It is great fun and good exercise. Once you do it, you will understand how much exercise it is going down hill.

To get more interest in our Summer venture to the mountains for backpacking we have tried to get more diversified options for our members' interests including horseback riding, biking, rafting, and day hikes in addition to backpacking. The Board is looking for ways to make this event successful. One suggestion is to move the trip from Labor Day weekend to July or early August so that kids are not in school and it can be a family trip. I think we should go to a resort like any in Summit or Eagle County because there is so much to do in the cool temps of Colorado. There is nothing better than playing golf in the mountains or sailing in Lake Dillon. Peak 8 at Breckenridge has the Alpine slide among other fun events. There is always some special event going on. In early August, I attended the Keystone Bluegrass and Beer Festival two-day event with close to 10,000 people each day. There were 45 breweries there from all over the country along with three music stages. For \$25 you received a beer glass to use to sample over 100 different beers. The music got better and better... This coming weekend at Keystone is the Wine, Jazz and Art Festival. I will report on this event next month.
